It is now the month of July, many of you are probably feeling exhausted from the months of summer. I know that by the time you are reading this, I will be feeling the burn of summer. We find ourselves constantly busy. I hear so many parents talk about how it is a goal to fill every day of the summer for their kids, thus conditioning them for the same hectic lives that we are already carrying.

This makes me wonder did we forget what God did on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of creation. "on the seventh day God finished his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation." He took a day of rest, or a sabbath. Did God really need to rest from creation? No, he didn't. He rested not for himself, but for us. He rested to teach us how to take a sabbath rest. As Jesus said, "And he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath."

We are not supposed to have every day scheduled. We are supposed to be taking days of rest, for our own sake. We burn ourselves out, we become crankier and less effective in our work. Our children are in key developmental years where they are supposed to be developing creativity. By being always, busy children have been stripped of the opportunities to discover and create new ways to be entertained.

I remember when I was 8 years old wondering around Ankeny with my friends and exploring different places to play. Were we bored at times? Yes. But I remember discovering this cool brush that had been crafted into a complex fort by various kids. I remember creating stories involving Super Heroes or having great baseball and football games.

The worst effect of making ourselves over involved is that we have sacrificed that which is most important. We have sacrificed God's Word. Many have decided that neglect of the Divine Service is an acceptable sacrifice to our altar of busyness. Many have decided that neglecting to attend a regular Bible class during the week, where we can dig deeper into God's word is less necessary than everything else. Its almost as if when we hear Jesus say that man lives not on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God, that Jesus wasn't talking about us.

Think about that, Jesus said it was more important for Him to be in God's word than to eat food. He is both the Word and the bread of life. He is what we need above all else. He is our sabbath rest. He says, "Come unto me all who are weary and heavy laden."

This summer what can you shave from your schedule. How can you give your children, grandchildren, or even yourself more opportunity to not be busy and explore the world given to you? What is the reason that you find yourselves neglecting weekend worship, daily prayer, or a regular Bible Study? How can you dedicate yourself to being in God's word above all? Perhaps we pray that God lead us and guide us to a life of service, but not without sabbath rest.

This summer many of you will be going on vacations. This can indeed be a sabbatical for you and your family. Indeed take these vacations even if you decide to go nowhere, or only a short distance, take it. However, should you travel a distance, still do not neglect God's word. Find a congregation where you are visiting, and attend their services.

You might learn something about that congregation, perhaps you can bring it back and may strengthen your overall walk in faith. 

**FROM THE PARISH NURSE**



There is a relatively new vaccine for adults called Shingrix for adults. This vaccine is to help prevent shingles. There is an older vaccine some people may have gotten for shingles called Zostavax. Zostavax is not as effective at preventing the shingles vaccine as the new Shingrix is. It is recommended people 50 and over be vaccinated for shingles with two doses of Shingrix given 2-6 months apart. Just what is shingles and why is it important to get vaccinated? The following information is taken from the website: [www.cdc.gov/shingles](http://www.cdc.gov/shingles). 1 out of 3 three people in the United

States will get shingles (also known as herpes zoster) during their lifetime. There are 1 million cases of shingles each year in this country. Anyone who has had chicken pox can get shingles. Even if you don't remember having had chicken pox, you should get the vaccine for shingles if you are 50 years and older. Shingles is a reactivation of the chicken pox virus. This virus stays dormant in your body after you have recovered from chicken pox. Scientists are unsure why this happens. Risk for shingles increases as we age. Shingles is a painful rash that develops on side of the face or body. The rash looks like blisters that scab over in 7-10 days and clear up in 2-4 weeks. Before the rash develops there is usually pain, itching or tingling where the rash develops. A person can't "catch" shingles from someone who has them, BUT if a person has never had chicken pox and comes in contact with the fluid from the blisters they could get chicken pox.

The biggest problem with shingles is the nerve pain that is associated with it. The pain can develop before the rash develops and be a problem for weeks, months or years afterward. This is called post herpetic neuralgia

(PHN). Shingles can affect the eye causing loss of vision. Call your physician as soon as possible if you suspect you have shingles since early treatment with antiviral medication is important. Talk to your doctor about the shingles vaccine even if you have a history of shingles since you can get shingles more than once.





**MAIN STREET LIVING IS A LUTHERAN TELEVISION PROGRAM** that is endorsed by the Iowa West District of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. The program receives no funding from the District, but is totally funded by viewers and congregations of the KCAU Viewing area.

The program is broadcast on **KCAU, the ABC network affiliate in Sioux City on Sunday morning, starting at 10:00 AM**. The first 30 minutes are remastered episodes of the popular "This is the Life" series that was very popular in the 70's and 80's. The second half of the program is a modified Lutheran worship service that features a different Pastor each week, from the station's broadcast area.



**ADULT INFORMATION CLASS** is for those considering joining this congregation and/or for members who want to refresh. *Basic Bible Teachings* is specifically designed to teach the basics of the Christian Faith, as found in Luther's Small Catechism, in easy-to-understand terms and in a highly visual format. 
