The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. (Mark 1:1)



Once again we gather together on our journey of Lent. We must begin again and again, because the old Adam in us must “by daily contrition and repentance, be drowned and die with all sins and evil lusts. . . . A new man should daily come forth and arise, who will live before God in righteousness and purity forever.” (*Small Catechism, Baptism, Fourth Part*)

But why? Why take the same journey to the cross? Why recount the same sins and hear the same words of forgiveness? Surely the Church has something more important to talk about. The reality is that there is nothing more important to talk about. This is the beginning, middle, and end of our identity as Christians. When we speak about Jesus Christ, we are speaking about the Gospel. Lent points us back to the simple and beautiful reality, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself (*2 Corinthians 5:19*).

FROM THE PARISH NURSE

March is National Multiple Sclerosis awareness month. The following information is taken from the website msfocus.org.



What is Multiple Sclerosis? MS is a chronic neurological condition that affects the central nervous system (CNS), which is comprised of the brain and spinal cord. In the CNS, nerve fibers (called axons) are protected by a fatty layer of insulation called myelin. Myelin allows nerve signals to travel properly.

In MS, overactive immune cells cause inflammation, which damages the myelin. This results in a loss of myelin – called demyelination – and some degree of axonal damage. Wherever the myelin is destroyed, a damaged area of white matter known as a lesion (or plaque) will occur. Over time, hardened scar tissue develops at the lesion site. This hardened scar tissue, or sclerosis, may develop at multiple sites throughout the CNS, hence the name multiple sclerosis. This scarring disrupts the transmission of nerve signals that communicate a desired action from the brain, through the spinal cord, to various parts of the body.

A simple illustration: Imagine this - you disconnect your cell phone from its charger as you get ready for a busy day. But even though it has been connected all night, you notice the battery is only partially charged. You look at the cord and notice a spot where the insulation has been stripped away and

the wires inside are exposed. Because the path by which the current travels is damaged, not all of the electricity sent from the outlet reached its target, your phone.

This analogy is helpful in understanding MS. When signals from the brain travel along nerves where the insulation has been damaged or lost, those signals may be interrupted or distorted, producing the many symptoms associated with MS.

MS can affect people of any age, any gender, and any ethnic background. However, some people do have a higher risk.

MS is significantly more common in women than men, by a ratio of as much as 3 to 1. It appears more frequently in Caucasians than in Hispanics or African Americans, and is relatively rare among Asians and certain other ethnic groups. MS is most commonly diagnosed in individuals between the ages of 20 and 40, although it can develop in young children, teens and older adults.

The risk for MS among the general population is relatively low. Individuals with a parent or sibling who is diagnosed with MS have a slightly increased risk.

In countries further from the equator, an increase in MS cases is noted. In the United States, the northern states (above the 37th parallel) have twice as many cases of MS as the southern states.

SHARA OSIRI IN KENYA CLINICAL OFFICER - LINUS.... Have you ever met someone and thought that there is "something" about this person that intrigues you? Maybe it is the way they present themselves, or the gentleness and compassion in their voice. Ugandan clinical officer, Linus was "that" person. He was a wonderful example of love overflowing. Whenever I saw him during the week, he was engaged with his patients and always ready to lend a hand. I saw him picking up crying children, helping to carry the elderly who struggled to walk, he consulted with me on the care of those who were very sick. There was a lady who was in distress and was eventually taken to the hospital. Linus looked after her and when she was

discharged, came back to the clinic to thank him. There was a mother who could not walk; Linus worked

with Dr. Olson (from the American team) to treat her and her children. He helped to carry them to each area to ensure they received the care that was needed staying with them until they were finished. Linus is currently clinic officer and wants to go back to medical school to become a “great physician” as he put it. I asked him, why he wanted to become a doctor and he told that he knew at an early age. In primary school he told his father that he wanted to study medicine and his father said that was too expensive. His mother and grandmother talked to his father and he slowly started saving money so Linus could go to medical school. Medical needs in Uganda are great and Linus desires to make a difference and save as many lives as he can. Interestingly enough, Linus just completed his studies to become a clinical officer months before the Mercy Medical Team came to Uganda. As he awaits placement, he volunteers at the local hospital. I asked him what he enjoyed about serving with the Mercy Medical Team, he replied, “About serving with Mercy Medical Team it was the best thing I have ever experienced since I born. I had never worked with international people in my life, I learned a lot from you people Dr. Jennifer was also teaching some new things. You people, you were very kind and caring may God bless you.
