#### Advent Season—2025

During the month of December and much of 2026, we will be spending a lot of time slowly working our way through the Gospel of Matthew. This will include our midweek Advent services. Here is a little bit of a preview of each Wednesday:

# Wednesday, December 3<sup>rd</sup>::The Generations of the Christ

Since January 1<sup>st</sup>, we as a congregation have worked our way through the entire Bible. We will conclude our journey with the Gospel of Matthew. Matthew, Chapter 1 begins with a genealogy that traces from Abraham to Jesus. It is quite the appropriate way to begin the final days of this year-long church campaign of "The Whole Story". We read a list of names that all point us back to the stories we have read through the year, these names remind us that all of it was about paving the way to Jesus and our salvation.

## Wednesday, December 10<sup>th</sup>::The Wise Men, Who are they?

Consider your typical Nativity set. The set includes a shelter of some sort. There might be a few animals. But what of the people? It usually includes: Mary, Joseph, baby Jesus, and some shepherds. Then there are these three strange individuals bearing gifts. Who are they? What is the big deal about them being included with story of Jesus' birth.

#### Wednesday, December 17<sup>th</sup>::The Christmas Blues

There is a harsh, and uncomfortable reality. Christmas Day is not always a day of joy. For many it can be a day of great grief. Christmas for many of us it is a day that is filled with great memories. I remember days spent with my grandparents, cousins, my mom and brother. However, they have passed away, and can only be seen in old photos and memories. Few days do people more miss loved ones who have died, then on Christmas.

Christmas is a day that we are expected to share with family, exchange gifts, and have a good meal together. Yet, many have no one to celebrate with due to careers, being in the military, or being estranged from family. Many can't afford gifts or a nice meal.

The service on December 17<sup>th</sup> is a day to remember and bring a little bit of hope and comfort to those for whom Christmas is a little blue.

#### Wednesday, December 24th::God is with us.

All year we've been giving away and carrying around "Flat Jesus". It was a reminder that God is with us. Looking at both Matthew, Chapter 1 and Matthew, Chapter 28, we will focus upon God's presence amongst us.

#### Thursday, December 25th::Why Jesus?

Mary and Joseph were both told to call their newborn baby, "Jesus". Why? What is in a name? We will focus upon why it is the name above all names.

Join us this Advent and Christmas season, as we conclude our journey through "The Whole Story". Join us as we meditate upon the God who is with us in the person of Jesus.



LWML BIBLE STUDY LEADER'S MEETING on Tuesday, December 16 at 1:00PM

LARGE LWML MITE BOX that is on the table in the narthex will be highlighted and along with the Mission Mite of the month, on the second Sunday of each month. December is: Growing Together to Share Braille and Large Print Lutheran Braille Workers, U.S. \$100,000 About This Mission Grant: Millions of people around the world are blind or visually impaired and are seeking to strengthen their Christian faith but find it difficult to access scripture-based reading materials. Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW) is committed to providing Christian materials in braille and specialized large print worldwide at no cost. With a part of the grant funds, LBW will establish five new Ministry Production Centers in the United States. LBW will hold five related servant events at LWML conventions, Lutheran universities and schools, and district youth gatherings. Service opportunities provide young people with the chance to grow in their God-given gifts and share the Gospel. This grant will allow LBW to produce and freely distribute approximately 10,000 additional volumes of Bibles and other Christian materials. This grant will be used to purchase specialized paper, card stock, braille plates and equipment, and for training and shipping costs.
