Reading from the Lutheran Confessions — “In the same way, the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, the Holy Spirit almighty; and yet there are not three Almightyies but one Almighty. So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God; and yet there are not three Gods, but one God. So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord; and yet there are not three Lords, but one Lord. Just as we are compelled by the Christian truth to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so also are we prohibited by the catholic religion to say that there are three Gods or Lords.” ~The Ecumenical Creeds, The Athanasian Creed
